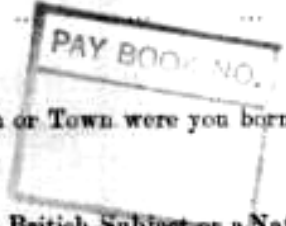

Duncan Robertson Barry B.A. now N^o 19506 Sapper. Field-
Engineers Australian Imperial Forces Abroad

Age. In his 34th year.

School career. Entered all Saints College Bathurst in 1894

In 1898 he won the "Field Scholarship" a scholarship offered by the Field Newspaper open to the state

In 1899 he passed the "junior" taking a first class in all (7) subjects gaining medals in Chemistry & Geology & was awarded the Watt Exhibition by the Chancellor of the University.

He then entered the Sydney Grammar School & in the following year passed the "senior" with eight A's & two B's gaining a medal in Physics

Entering St. Pauls College within the University he held the College scholarship in the Arts Course each year & finally took his degree at the end of the term with first class honors in Mathematics & second class in Geology

After a short term as tutor in his college he entered

the service of the Colonial Sugar Company. He is still
on the Staff having been granted leave to go on
active service. He enlisted in the Engineers in
Sydney & reached England at Amersham.
He married in 1911 - she a wife & two
children
