GEORGE THOMAS MCLIVEN.

George Thomas McIlveen, aged 61, died at his residence, "Yandoya," Cobra Street, yesterday morning, after an illness lasting for some months. The late Mr. McIlveen was a native of Sydney, and came to the Dubbo district 40 years ago, settling at Collie, and becoming the owner of the "Dragon," "Orlando" and "Wahroonga" stations. He was married on July 3rd, 1895, to Miss Maude Meers, at Dick's Camp, Collie, and Mrs. McIlveen being a member of the well-known Collie family of her maiden name. Besides his widow, Mr. McIlveen leaves five children to mourn his loss. Four of these are sons, **Laurence**, Neville, Allan and Trevor, and one daughter, Maisie. The family's home has always been at "Orlando," but Mr. McIlveen moved into Dubbo nine months ago on account of his health.

The funeral took place this morning in the Church of England portion of the cemetery, the Rev. C. W. Leavers officiating at the graveside.
